Votes by your state legislators on key small business issues are listed here. Although this Voting Record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislator's attitudes toward small business. Please thank those legislators who supported small business.

BOTH CHAMBERS

1. Licensing and permitting clarity (2023 - HB 2019): Requires municipalities to list, in simple language, the criteria for granting a license or permit. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 17-11. Passed the House 49-7. Signed by the governor.

2. Unemployment insurance eligibility requirements (2023 - HB 2108): Changes the unemployment insurance benefits eligibility requirements and identity verification process to increase accountability of those receiving benefits. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-14. Passed the House 31-27. Vetoed by the governor.

3. Administrative transparency (2024 - HB 2100): Directs state agencies to include on their website a list of items needed for an application to be deemed administratively complete. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-12. Passed the House 31-26. Vetoed by the governor.

4. Property tax abatement limitations (2024 - HB 2309): Reduces the maximum lease and abatement period for property subject to the government property lease excise tax (GPLET) from eight to four years. This legislation also outlines posting requirements for GPLET leases, development agreements and reports. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-12. Passed the House 31-28. Vetoed by the governor.

5. Central TPT audit authority (2024 - HB 2380): Reinforces the Arizona Department of Revenue's authority to approve or deny a city or town's request to audit a transaction privilege tax (TPT) taxpayer located in more than one city or town. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 25-3. Passed the House 54-4. Signed by the governor.

6. Shoplifting; prior offenses; look back (2024 - SB 1412): Allows prosecutors to exclude time spent in state custody in cases where additional crimes were committed. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 22-6. Passed the House 42-17. Vetoed by the governor.

7. Organized retail theft; repeat offenders (2024 - SB 1414): Requires a person who is convicted of a third or subsequent violation of organized retail theft with the intent to resell or trade the stolen merchandise to be sentenced as a category two repeat offender. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-14. Passed the House 37-22. Vetoed by the governor.

SENATE ONLY

8. Business personal property elimination (2023 - SB 1263): Eliminates locally assessed business personal property taxes. **A "YES" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 16-13.

HOUSE ONLY

9. Health insurance industry grievance process (2023 - HB 2290): Creates duplicative state bureaucracy for health care grievances and imposes new mandates on health care coverage providers. **A "NO" vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the House 42-18.
