Votes by your state legislators on key small business issues are listed here. Although this Voting Record does not reflect all elements considered by a lawmaker when voting, nor does it represent a complete profile of a legislator, it can be a guide in evaluating your legislator's attitudes toward small business. Please thank those legislators who supported small business.

BOTH CHAMBERS

1. Pass-Through Entity Tax Credit (2023 – House Bill 368): Converts the income tax exemption on income subject to the entity-level tax to a credit for the owners of pass-through entities (PTE) that elect to pay an entity-level tax. **A “YES” vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 34-0. Passed the House 64-0. Signed by the governor.

2. Medical Malpractice Changes (2023 – Senate Bill 523): Amends the Medical Malpractice Act to change the limitation of recovery for certain claims against facilities that are not hospital-controlled. **A “YES” vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 40-2. Passed the House 63-0. Signed by the governor.

3. Paid Family Medical Leave Act (2024 – Senate Bill 3): Codifies a 12-week paid family medical leave (PFML) benefit for nearly all workers in the state and establishes a state-run PFML program for employees who do not receive a qualifying benefit from their employers. **A “NO” vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 25-15. Failed in the House 34-36.

4. Clean Transportation Fuel Standards (2024 – House Bill 41): Provides the Environmental Improvement Board (EIB) with the necessary statutory authority to draft and enforce a statewide clean transportation fuel standard and empowers the New Mexico Environment Department to maintain, develop, and enforce program regulations. **A “NO” vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 26-15. Passed the House 36-33. Signed by the governor.

5. Health Insurance Coverage Mandate (2023 – Senate Bill 132): Requires all types of health insurance products to provide for the prevention and treatment of sexually transmitted infections to those

covered without coinsurance, including policy deductibles, copayments, or coinsurance. **A “NO” vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 26-13. Passed the House 42-23. Signed by the governor.

SENATE ONLY

6. Paid Family & Medical Leave Act (2023 – Senate Bill 11): Proposed to establish a 12-week Paid Family Medical Leave (PFML) benefit for nearly all workers in the state. The proposal would have required employee contributions of 0.5 percent and employer contributions of 0.4 percent of wages into the newly established fund. **A “NO” vote supports the NFIB position.** Passed the Senate 23-15.
