Register

October 16: Voter registration deadline.

Voting

Early voting and vote-by-mail are available to all voters.

September 23: In-person early voting locations open

October 27: Deadline to request to receive a vote-by-mail ballot by mail.

November 4: In-person early voting ends.

November 7: Election Day; vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked by this date, or returned to local general registrar's office by 7:00 p.m.

ID Requirements

Virginia law requires all voters to provide either an acceptable form of ID or sign an ID Confirmation Statement at the polls.

Polling Place Details

Polling places are open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
